### **200% Federal Poverty Level Programs:**

- Home Weatherization Assistance Program (HWAP)
- Emergency Home Energy Assistance Program (E-HEAP) or known as the Winter Crisis Program
- Emergency Food & Shelter Program (EFSP) for Rental Assistance
- Food Pantries

### **150% Federal Poverty Level Programs:**

- Columbia Gas WarmChoice® Program
- Senior Levy Emergency Home Repair Program
- Central Ohio Area Agency on Aging (COAAA) Emergency Home Repair Program
- Clothes Closets

### **35% Area Median Income Programs:**

- Ohio Housing Trust Fund (OHTF) Emergency Home Repair and Handicapped Accessibility Program

### **Must be on PIPP and a Regulated Electric Utility Baseload User:**

- Universal Service Fund; Electric Partnership Program

Most of these programs allow for the use of the current year Federal Poverty Level usually issued in February as posted in the Federal Register on April 1 of each year.
